2024 Overview

- 1. Students can sign up for the virtual program between Sept and Jan. 2024. If interested, please register for an orientation session.
- 2. Once registered, students will receive a confirmation email outlining the program and must sign and return a Student Agreement Form.
- 3. The program will run from Mid Oct Mid May ending with a virtual showcase.

Procedures

- 1. Students will work at their own pace to complete the task emailed to them at the beginning of each month. Each task will have an "exit ticket" that will be reviewed by an ACE Mentor who will provide feedback to ensure mastery. Each month students will work on a portion of their final project, which will also be reviewed by an ACE Mentor.
- 2. Students can submit questions through a form that will be linked in the welcome email. Questions will be answered in 36 hours of submission.
- 3. Before the Showcase, students will have the option to present their presentation live or schedule ahead of time to pre-record.

2023-24 RFP
