Fallingwater Institute High School Residencies are led by teaching architects and teaching artists, suitable for high school students who are interested in architecture, art, construction, design, and engineering.

Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in 1935 for the Edgar J. Kaufmann family of Pittsburgh, Fallingwater is famous the world-over and attracts thousands of visitors each year. Owned and operated by the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy, it was named the "Best All-time Work of Architecture" by the American Institute of Architects in 1986, a National Historic Landmark in 1976, a Pennsylvania Commonwealth Treasure in 2000, and in 2019 was inscribed to the World Heritage list by UNESCO (United Nations Educational and Scientific Organization).
